A total of \$12,000 was gathered from various Rotary sources to purchase furnishings, lockers, eating utensils and books, dramatically changing these children's lives for the better. Last year, with funds

raised through the International Dinner and the RI Matching Grant Program, we provided wireless communication to remote villages in Nepal. These are just two examples of wonderful projects that have been funded by the International Dinner!

Next, John Sirianni and Vincent Sementilli presented Marie McCaig and Grace Rosettie with a check from the Club for their very worthwhile Teen Angels program. Marie explained that the program helped 150 needy teens and 2008, and it is expected to serve over 100 youths this Christmas season.

Scott Bloor gave new meaning to the acronym VSP: Very Sick of Poinsettias. Actually, it means Voluntary Service Plan, and so far the Club has raised \$9,297 year to date against a budget of \$10,000. Regular Club dues were due to Scott by August 15th, but there are a few stragglers out there. It is imperative that you send your dues in by November 30th or you will be dropped from the membership rolls as per RI. Next year, the deadline will be moved up to August 30th in order to maintain active membership status.

Given all the excitement of the meeting, **President Rod** gave everyone a pass on mandatory fines this week.
